Exam #9 - CMSC132 (Summer 2022)

Time: The exam will be posted on Tuesday Aug, 2 at 1 PM (afternoon), and due the same day, Tuesday Aug., 2 at 1:50 PM (afternoon).

Content: This is a written exam, not coding on Eclipse. You will be given a pdf with short answer questions on it. You will open up your favorite word processor and type out the answers to the questions. You will turn it into a pdf and submit the pdf on the submit server via upload (not click submit project). By short answers, I mean true/false, fill in the blank, write out the answer, answer question about code segment, etc. You can use notes, videos, slides, and examples, but please, no searching the web. You should study as you will have only 50 minutes, so if you are trying to look everything up and/or learn the concept during the exam, you will run out of time to type out your answers. For exam 9, you are responsible for everything, yes everything (including lab), that was covered in Week 1 to Week 5 (including Week 5).

Details:
