1. (10) Let  $\Omega = \{ \boldsymbol{x} : -2 \le x_1 \le 1, -1 \le x_2 \le 1 \}$ , and let  $\Gamma(\Omega)$  be the boundary of  $\Omega$ . Let

$$q(\mathbf{x},t) = 3x_1 - 2t(x_2 - 1)(x_1 + 1) - 6t + 2t^2.$$

Consider the problem

$$\frac{\partial u(\boldsymbol{x},t)}{\partial t} - \Delta u(\boldsymbol{x},t) = q(\boldsymbol{x},t) \quad \text{for } \boldsymbol{x} \in \Omega \subset \mathcal{R}^2, t \in \mathcal{R}_+$$
$$u(\boldsymbol{x},0) = 3x_1 \quad \text{for } \boldsymbol{x} \in \Omega$$
$$u(\boldsymbol{x},t) = tx_1x_2 \quad \text{for } \boldsymbol{x} \in \Gamma(\Omega), t \in \mathcal{R}_+$$

Give a bound on

$$\max_{0 \le t \le 5} \max_{\boldsymbol{x} \in \Omega} |u(\boldsymbol{x}, t)|.$$

2. (10) Suppose that the problem

$$-\Delta w = f(\mathbf{x})$$
 for  $\mathbf{x} \in \Omega$ ,  
 $w(\mathbf{x}) = 0$  for  $\mathbf{x} \in \Gamma(\Omega)$ 

has been discretized using piecewise linear finite elements (with basis functions  $\phi_j$ ) to obtain the linear system  $\boldsymbol{A}\boldsymbol{w}=\boldsymbol{f}$ . The  $2\times n$  matrix  $\boldsymbol{P}$  contains the coordinates of the vertices of the triangles of the mesh, the vector  $\boldsymbol{w}$  contains the values of the approximate solution at the vertices, and  $f_j=(f,\phi_j)$ . Also suppose that you are given a matrix  $\boldsymbol{B}$ , the mass matrix, with entries  $b_{ij}=(\phi_i,\phi_j)$ .

Now suppose we want to solve

$$u_t - \Delta u = f(\mathbf{x}) \quad \text{for } \mathbf{x} \in \Omega, t \ge 0,$$
  
 $u(\mathbf{x}, 0) = v(\mathbf{x}) \quad \text{for } \mathbf{x} \in \Omega$   
 $u(\mathbf{x}, t) = 0 \quad \text{for } \mathbf{x} \in \Gamma(\Omega), t \in \mathcal{R}_+$ 

Write Matlab code to obtain an approximate solution to this problem for  $t = 0, 0.1, 0.2, \dots 1.0$  using the backward Euler method in time and finite elements in space. (If this is too confusing, you can get up to 7 points credit for forward Euler.)
