

## PROJECT

The projects can be done by either an individual or a team of 2. I might allow a team of 3 if you can argue why it makes sense.

Here is what you must do for your project and when you must do it by.

1. Pick a conflict in the world of politics where there are least 6 points of dispute. Meet with me with your choice to get it approved. Meeting should be before 5:00 on Feb 16.
2. Part 1 of your paper: Summarize the history and context of the conflict.
3. Part 2 of your paper: List out the items of dispute and assign point values for each one for each part (the first step of AW). Justify the point values you assign.
4. Part 3: Apply AW.
5. Part 4: Discuss your results. Contrast them to the solution that was actually achieved if there was one. It is FINE if your solution does not match what happened; however, you may want to explain that if you can. If your conflict had no solution discuss honestly if your solution would work, why or why not. (Its okay if its a NO.)
6. Give a 15-minute presentation on your paper in class. The presentations will be on April 27, April 29, May 4, May 6. (May 11, the last day of class, will be a review for the final.) If there are too many projects to fit into these four days (e.g., if everyone does a solo project) then we will have one additional meeting at night.
7. Hardcopy of your project is MORALLY DUE April 22; however, since your apartment was flooded on April 21, I will let you hand it in April 27.

Caveats:

1. Any typed format is okay.
2. Length: No real restriction either way. However, if it under 3 pages or over 10 then something has gone wrong.
3. References: You should name your sources and justify your scores with some references. Wikipedia is fine but should not be your only source.
4. None of these rules above are absolute. If you have a problem with any of them then come see me and we'll see whats up.
5. The presentation can be PowerPoint or blackboard.
6. The chapter in the book on the Camp David Treaty and my presentation of it on Tuesday Feb 2 will be a good example of what a project should be. Except for one thing- they do not give references and you should.
