The Web is Scary

Be Careful!

- **Anybody can create a web page**
- **Web sites are not typically reviewed by experts**
- **Information may be inaccurate, biased, out-of-date, propaganda, or just plain lies!**

Evaluating Web Sources

- Does the URL look like a personal page?
- Is it written by an expert?
 - Is information included about the author?
 - Try doing a search for the author's name
- Is the domain name a known entity?
 - www.washingtonpost.com
 - www.nih.gov
- Is it current? (Look for “last updated...”)
- Are sources cited?
- Does it appear biased?
- What is the author's motivation? Conveying information?
Selling something? Political agenda?

Hints

- Use **Identifiers** for each item you want to style uniquely
- Use Two **classes** for the table (evenRow, oddRow)
- Create three separate **divisions** (intro, facts, data)
- Colors used: lightblue, orange, yellow, red, blue, black, rgb(50, 220,200)
- Don't forget at the top of your HTML file:

`<link rel="stylesheet" type="text/css" href="StyleSeparated.css" />`

- Properties set:
 - background-color (for body and divisions)
 - color
 - font-family (“arial”, “algerian”, “Bradley Hand ITC”)
 - font-weight (set to “bold” sometimes)
 - text-align (used to center the main title)
 - font-size
 - border (set to “inset” for divisions; “ridge” for table)
 - border-width
 - padding (used to put some space *inside* the divisions)
 - margin (used to put space *around* divisions, and also around the entire “body”)
