1. [20 pnts.] Disprove by counter example or Prove each of the following:

a. The rational numbers are closed under division. (Note: This means “Dividing any rational by an rational must result in a rational number.”)

b. No perfect square has the form $2(2k + 1)$.

$$\forall n \in \mathbb{Z}, n \in \mathbb{Z}^{perfectsquare} \rightarrow \sim \exists k \in \mathbb{Z}, n = 2(2k + 1)$$

$$\forall n \in \mathbb{Z}, n \in \mathbb{Z}^{perfectsquare} \rightarrow \forall k \in \mathbb{Z}, n \neq 2(2k + 1)$$

2. [4 pnts.] Write the standard factored form of 450:

3. [6 pnts.] Use the unique factorization theorem and suppose that m is an integer such that

$$4 * 3 * 2 * m = 7 * 8 * 9 * 10$$
