

Details about Quiz 5

The fifth and final quiz for the course will take place on **Wednesday, May 6**.

This quiz will function as a **mini-project**, designed to be completed in **50 minutes or less**. Similar to a regular project, you will:

- Download the starter files,
- Develop your solution,
- Submit your code to the Submit Server to check against the automated tests.

You may use **lecture slides, recorded videos, API pages, and class code samples**. However, this is an **individual assignment**:

- **Do not work with others.**
- **Do not use the web or AI services to find or generate code.**

TAs will be available to **clarify directions**, but they **will not assist with debugging**.

Key Details:

- **Quiz Availability:** The quiz will be posted at **10:00 AM on Wednesday, May 6th on Piazza**.
- **No Class:** To ensure everyone has at least 50 uninterrupted minutes, both **lecture and lab are canceled on May 6th**.
- **Due Time:** Submissions are due by **5:00 PM**.
 - Submissions from **5:00–6:00 PM** will incur a **5-point deduction (out of 30)**.
